

Show Points Coordinator

Mission: To compile, calculate and verify points for yearend awards and relay that information to the Year End Award Chair.

Obtain current MPtHA Year End Awards Program Rules and make yourself familiar with all rules. The rules are published on the website or can be obtained from the Year End Awards Chair after the April board meeting.

At the beginning of every year, after the showbill has been approved by the Board and PtHA, update the awards criteria reports for Open, Amateur and Youth with any class number changes, class description changes, class additions or deletions. Have this reviewed by the Year End Awards Committee and Board.

General Criteria:

- The **owner** of the Horse/Pony/Miniature/Utility/Solid Pinto Horse in Open classes, or the **exhibitor** in Youth or Amateur classes, **must be** a current member in good standing of the MPtHA. Lessee is considered the horse owner for purposes of year-end awards. Dues must be paid prior to the end of any show in order for points to be awarded for that show.
- All division placings are calculated for first through sixth place.
- Awards will not be made with a single award recipient. However, points earned in that class will count toward division high points.
- Classes conducted at a single show will not count. However, points earned in that class will count toward division high points.
- Halter Grand and Reserve Points will not count in computation of high point awards.
- Points will be awarded using the PtHA year-end point system per judge. Classes with less than 3 entries, if held, will be awarded (fraction) points for Minnesota year-end awards only.
- In the event of a Jubilee show, individual judge's points from the show will count toward Minnesota Pinto year-end awards, but not the extra set of average points.
- Where there are classes with "mixed types" make sure that you include only that type that complies with the criteria for that division.
- Multiple riders on one horse can occur, make sure points are separated and listed per horse/rider or handler unit)

Provide the Show Secretary with a year-end awards class and division high point criteria for show database, by open, amateur and youth prior to the first show.

Produce show points by show report after each MPtHA show. Take reports produced by the Show Secretary and sort them by Open, Amateur and Youth. Verify MPtHA points with the Judges' Cards Report received from PtHA.

Produce the year-end results report based on the criteria for Year End Awards Committee for Open, Amateur and Youth awards per show and a final year-end results report. The Awards Committee will review the results and may request revisions to the report, if corrections need to be made.

After Yearend results are finalized, prepare a yearend awards list for Year End Awards Chair, Directory Chair, Newsletter Editor, Banquet Chair, Expo Chair and Website.

All results are not to be released until after the Awards Banquet in January.
